Start at YMCA Holt Early Learning Centre

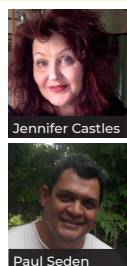
- STOP 1** Grassy area in front of YMCA Holt Early Learning Centre. It's 35m to Stop 2.
- STOP 2** Corner of footpath between Early Learning Centre & neighbouring units. It's 40m to Stop 3.
- STOP 3** Middle of footpath between Early Learning Centre & neighbouring units. It's 40m to Stop 4.
- STOP 4** Footpath next to Club Lime & Sculptures Store. It's 70m to Stop 5.
- STOP 5** Colourful squiggly archway at the back corner of Kippax Library. It's 55m to Stop 6.
- STOP 6** Front of Kippax Library. It's 30m to Stop 7.
- STOP 7** Kippax Shops Playground. It's 140m to Stop 8.
- STOP 8** Hardwick Cres pedestrian crossing, opposite Kippax Uniting Church. It's 60m to Stop 9.
- STOP 9** Front of Kippax Uniting Church. It's 50m to Stop 10.
- STOP 10** Footpath next to back carpark of Kippax Uniting Church. It's 30m to Stop 11.
- STOP 11** Front of West Belconnen Child & Family Centre. It's 110m back to Stop 1.
