EMANUEL (MANNIE) REES, BRIEF BIOGRAPHY.

Mannie Rees was born in Cooma, NSW, on 27 June 1922, the second of the five sons of Mabel and Frank Rees, a blade Shearer. The family moved to Canberra in 1925, where they lived for a almost years at the Molonglo Settlement before moving to the Causeway in December 1926. They lived there for the next ten years then before moving to Ainslie in 1936. His father worked as a labourer, digging water and sewerage trenches around Canberra, and Mannie attended St Christopher's School, Manuka, from 1928-36. On leaving school, he worked for the General Post Office in Parkes as a messenger until his appointment as postman in 1940. After serving with the Army in Australia during the Second World War, he returned to the Engineering Branch of the Post Office where he worked as a clerk from 1945 until his retirement in 1982. Married in 1950, Mannie built a house in O'Connor in 1952, where he lived for 15 years before moving to Hackett.

NOTE ON PERSONAL RECORDS.

Mr Rees has two photographs of the house he lived in from 1925-26 in the Molonglo Settlement and a number of photographs of the 1925 flood, taken at Queanbeyan. He thinks he has other photographs that he will look for.
